The beagles were being bred for medical procedures. The DOJ conducted numerous inspections and found many violations for unsanitary conditions.

The HSMC (Eddie Leedy & Robby Clemons) drove to the breeder facility to pick up 15 pups. The beagles were so happy and excited and enjoying being out running around together. They have never been outside of a cage or out in the fresh air.

Queen Elizabeth (the Jack Russell mix) was picked up as a stray by MCAS. They knew something was wrong and needed to get her to the HSMC right away for x-rays. Dr. Lynn with MCAS believed she was hit by a car and the x-rays we took confirmed our worst fears. She had a left femur fracture and a right iliac body fracture. At that time, we decided to take on this medical case. **"All dogs and cats are special and deserve a fighting chance."**



She was transferred from MCAS the next morning. We scheduled an emergency surgery at Blue Pearl of Maitland. They did such a wonderful and careful job with her, and she is now safely back in our care. Special thanks to Dr. Ingrid Souza for agreeing to be her medical foster! Queen Elizabeth's road to recovery will be a long one and her hospital bill at Blue Pearl was **\$8,800** for a surgery she so desperately needed to survive with any quality of life.

Coldplay was brought in by a good Samaritan. He was extremely emaciated, jaundiced, and malnourished weighing only 5 lbs. Quickly it was recognized he had medical issues pertaining to his liver which is why he had a yellow complexion. Immediately we started medication and fluid treatments, he went to foster at 8.5 lbs. After 2 more weeks, he went up to 10lbs and was transferred to our Petco Cat Adoption Center and adopted and he is now living his best life!



Pandora came to us with wounds indicating she had been picked up by a bird of prey. A police officer dropped her off at the crack of dawn on New Year's Day shortly after he found her completely unable to move with talon lacerations all over her body. Without any veterinary help readily available on the holiday, our cat staff at the HSMC examined her and worked tirelessly to get her stabilized. She was sent to foster and, by a miracle, she was able to regain use of her back legs shortly after a little bit of TLC. However, after a month and a half in foster care, it was realized we were not going to be able to save her left arm due to an abscess. After recovering from her amputation, she came back from foster and was sent to our Petco Cat Adoption Center where she found her "fur"ever home within 3 days!
